## INTRODUCTION

The ZimRights is Zimbabwe's first post-independence indigenous human rights advocacy group established in 1992 as an association of ordinary people and registered as a PVO in 1993. Over the past 30 years, ZimRights has grown to over 250 000 members across the country's 10 provinces. Under ZimRights' new strategy – the Shifting Power to the People Strategy, ZimRights members work through 8 action zones to advance various human rights issues in their communities.



### These are:

- Human Rights Monitoring and Response,
- Civic Education,
- Peace Building,
- Mobilisation (membership engagement),
- Youth,
- Elections and Democracy,
- · Women and Human Rights and
- Media and Advocacy.

Figure 1 below shows these 8 Action Zones and the work they do.



This factsheet focuses on the Elections and Democracy Action Zone. The Elections and Democracy Action Zone is concerned with promoting effective participation of citizens and communities in democratic processes.



# WHAT IS THE LEGACY OF ZIMRIGHTS ON DEMOCRATIC PROCESSES IN ZIMBABWE?

While packaged differently under the SP2P Strategy, ZimRights Democracy and Elections Action Zone is not new. It has been in existence prior to the SP2P known simply as the Elections Desk.



Since 1992, ZimRights has accompanied and supported Zimbabwean communities on their human rights and democracy journey. As the country's oldest and largest human rights grassroots movement, ZimRights has been engaged in some of the most historic democratic processes. These include the birth of the constitutional reform movement and election observation in the 1990s.

These processes saw ZimRights play influential roles that led to a new constitution in 2013 and the establishment of solid election monitoring and observation presence and organizations post-2000. With the coming into effect of the 2013 Constitution, ZimRights worked with many civil society organizations to push for the operationalisation of institutions that support democracy and good governance in line with Chapter 12 of the Constitution of Zimbabwe.

On the ground, ZimRights has mobilized millions of Zimbabweans to play an effective role in advancing democracy and good governance. Through various capacity-building programs, ZimRights has empowered many citizens, beyond its 250,000 members, on Zimbabwe's democracy journey. ZimRights members are the backbone of citizen participation in elections, serving as election officials in support of various official bodies and as election observers and human rights monitors. ZimRights members have consistently:

- Monitored the integrity of electoral processes at different stages of the electoral cycle.
- · Mobilising other citizens to show up in democratic processes.
- Constituted part of the electorate through casting their votes.

These experiences, over 30 years, have made the ZimRights membership a force to reckon with, promoting a culture of participation in electoral and democratic processes.

# WHAT IS THE LINK BETWEEN **HUMAN RIGHTS, ELECTIONS AND DEMOCRACY?**

Why should ZimRights, a human rights organisation care about elections and democracy? ZimRights cares about elections and democracy because both the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) and Zimbabwe's bill of rights care about democracy and elections.

AS ARTICLE 21:3 OF THE UDHR STATES

The will of the people shall be the basis of the authority of government; this will shall be expressed in periodic and genuine elections which shall be by universal and equal suffrage and shall be held by secret vote or by equivalent free voting procedures.



Our own Constitution embodies civil and political rights which are essentially the right to participate in civic life. Section 67 of the Constitution of Zimbabwe states clearly as follows:

"Every Zimbabwean citizen has the right: (a) To free, fair and regular elections for any elective public office established in terms of this Constitution or any other law; and

(b) To make political choices freely."



The section goes further to speak of the right to participate in political activity and to influence, challenge or support the policies of government or any political party.

It is the participation of ordinary people in civic life, in politics, that gives meaning to democracy. As such, empowering communities to exercise their civic rights in election and democratic process is indeed a human rights agenda.



# HOW DO WE SUPPORT CITIZENS AND COMMUNITIES IN ELECTIONS AND OTHER DEMOCRATIC PROCESSES?

Our part as a mass movement in realising the rights enshrined in section 67 of the Constitution is to provide support to communities so that they can participate in elections and democratic process in a manner that is meaningful and effective. We do this work through the Elections and Democracy action zone.

This zone works towards the following:

- Supporting the effective participation of citizens and communities in elections and other democratic processes;
- Empowering citizens to monitor and respond to human rights violations before, during and after elections and other democratic processes.
- Contributing to the advancement of democratic, transparent and credible electoral processes which are in line with the Constitution of Zimbabwe, regional and international standards.
- Supporting civil society partners in their watchdog role over elections and other democratic processes in Zimbabwe.



# WHAT KEY INTERVENTIONS DO WE **UNDERTAKE TO ACHIEVE THE ABOVE?**

Over the years, we have undertaken a number of initiatives to achieve the objectives mentioned above.

### a. 10x10 Voter Mobilisation Campaign


